Thankfully, we have discovered there are a multitude of new and creative ways to do the important work God has set before us.

Physically coming back together when it feels safe for most to do so is crucial to St. John's growing and thriving as we transition in the months ahead. While doing things virtually has served us well in many ways, there is no substitute for actually being together in person as we do the messy work of being the church in community. As we engage in this "darn tough" work of transitioning, may we look to God for guidance, confident we are not alone as we step into a future filled with possibility and hope.

Notes from Church Council

Financial Report: Matt Carson, Treasurer:

January was a good month financially for St. John's.
January income of \$52,207 exceeded our monthly expenses, starting us off about 10.3% over budget. Tithes and offerings of \$37,737 also exceeded the forecast of \$33,750.



Our 2022 commitment to "Our Church's Wider Mission" (OCWM) is \$48,272, or \$3,364 per month. January contributions got off to a terrific start with \$6,475 donated, almost double our monthly goal! St. John's continues to show a great amount of support for this important part of our mission.

Rev. Addie Stong, Associate Pastor:

Carryout Connection continues with the help of Rev. Kim Stryak. The Confirmation Class met in person on Sunday, February 13.

The Carryout Connection program has been drawing in more people than on a typical Sunday morning prepandemic with a wider reach to grandkids and neighbors.

Andrew Paulson, Minister of Music:

Ensembles have resumed. Chancel Choir, United Ringers, and Children's Choir are resuming their usual roles on Sunday mornings.

Artist Series are planned for Sunday, March 27 (Andrew Paulson and John Pennington on piano, organ, and percussion), and April IO (Palm Sunday, featuring the Chancel Choir and a chamber ensemble).

Abbie Lampe, Minister of Music for Children and Youth:

Children's Choir has resumed via Zoom and in person. They are preparing Ash Wednesday and Easter music.

Lisa Delp, Office Administrator:

St. John's has helped the community with \$1,565 for grocery/gas gift cards, temporary housing, and a post-office box. AA will begin meeting at St. John's on March I.

An announcement was made on January 16, 2022, to the congregation regarding their generosity in 2021. The PSEC sent a letter to all churches in the conference about their financial status in 2021. They were able to end \$200 in the black.

New Business:

Creation Stewards

Don Atkiss introduced "People Advancing Reintroduction" to Council. The program employs former convicts and reintroduces them into society. They will hold an electronics recycling program.

Lansdale Police

St. John's received a letter from the department thanking us for our donation to their DARE program.

Church Security

Mark Bruen and Bill Leslie will discuss church security with the Lansdale Police Department.

New Council Members

Installation of new Council members will be held on Sunday, March 6, at the I0:15 AM service. Following the service, a brief orientation will be held with the confirmands to discuss church organization.

Search Committee

Kevin McLemore, Associate Conference Minister for Search and Call, will help St. John's with the search for a new senior pastor and an interim pastor. The search committee will be headed by the Elders, along with representation from the congregation. As I write to you at the beginning of March, this little church mouse does so well-supplied with Girl Scout cookies, thanks to St. John's Girl Scouts and the drive-



through they provided for church folks and the community. Of course, I didn't need to drive to get my cookies—I just perched on the rock at the center of the labyrinth and was well taken care of by some very friendly and polite Girl Scouts!


With cookies and a cup of tea, I have been reading the book that is at the center of this year's Lenten Study: Rachel Held Evans's book titled *Wholehearted Faith*. One other important item for your March calendar: on Sunday, March 6, at the 10:15 AM worship service, St. John's Council will be installed with the laying on of hands, celebrating new volunteers who will lead the congregation in the days ahead. Throughout the pandemic, the Church Council has met virtually to conduct the church's business, keeping things running smoothly amid some particularly challenging times. While in-person meetings will resume on certain occasions, virtual meetings will continue to occur, allowing folks to serve in leadership roles who would not have been able to do so in the past, a reminder that good often emerges during tough times, and challenges urge us to learn, grow, and find better ways to do things. St. John's 2021 OCWM Contributions

On January 16, Bill Leslie, President of Church Council, spoke to the congregation during the church services to announce some outstanding news regarding St. John's contributions to the UCC OCWM fund. OCWM stands for Our Church's Wider Mission. Most of us know this as one of the two lines on our weekly offering envelope. But it is truly a very important part of what being a church is all about. Helping others.

OCWM is money that supports UCC activities beyond the walls of St. John's. OCWM contributions are sent to the UCC conference throughout the year for use in providing support to other UCC churches in need, for funding national and global projects and scholarships, for education and training of missionaries, and many other important outreach activities.

Every year, as part of the budget process, Council approves an amount for St. Johns to commit to OCWM. For 2021, that amount was \$46,460. This This was the same number as our pledge for 2019 and 2020. Regular readers of the bulletin or the Herald know that, for 2021, it worked out to \$893.00 per week. In reading the bulletin and Herald, you also may have noticed that throughout the year, that weekly number was exceeded significantly, often.

To say that this was unexpected is a serious understatement given that we are all still dealing with a pandemic with all its associated economic and emotional impacts. St. John's congregation looked these obstacles in the eye and did not blink. Instead, we decided 2021 was a year that it was more important than ever to support not just the church, but also OCWM.

For 2021, the total amount that St. John's members gave to OCWM was \$59,032, almost \$13,000 more than was pledged by Council at the start of the year.

Church Council felt it was important to share this incredible news. We all want to thank you, the congregation of this incredible institution, for your unprecedented generosity.

2022 St. John's Address Directory


