First Sunday of Advent/Love Gift Sunday

This profound expression of God's redemptive purposes found in stanza three of our featured Advent hymn, *Of the Father's Love Begotten*, capsulizes the miracle of the Word becoming Flesh. Said in a slightly different way, *The Divine Word Became Jesus*. This is no minor thing. It was an earth-shattering revelation because Love, in its fullest expression and intensity, was coming to live with us forever. That love lives today, despite attempts to dismiss or undermine it.

On this first Sunday of Advent, we get this first glimpse of Love as understood through Mary's love of God when she said, *let it be with me according to your word*.




