CHURCH COUNCIL NOTES



Financial Report: Matt Carson, Treasurer In October we had income of \$49,344.13 against expenses of \$49,526.64 Expenses were high for October, exceeding the budgeted amount of \$47,288.61.

At this point in the year we have gross income of \$347,210.78, and have budgeted that we would receive \$357,152.00, meaning we are short \$9,941.22 from where we expected to be in terms of income year to date. Total expenses are \$492,364.75 against budgeted expenses of \$498,111.47 YTD, meaning we have spent \$5,746.72 less so far this year than we budgeted to spend.

Including budget transfers YTD of \$106,968.30, we have income of \$454,179.08, against the total expenses. That means we are about 8% behind breaking even for the year. We expected income and transfers of \$464,120.30 against expected expenses of \$498,111.47, meaning we continue to be pacing about 1% behind our budget for the year so far.

Donations received for Our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) for October were \$4,300.50 and \$33,243.75 for 2023 YTD. We are behind our projection by \$4,421.

Report on Social Media Use: (Liz Rivett)

Following our discussion at the September Council Meeting, the same member of our private Facebook page again made an inappropriate posting on our page. The Executive Committee reviewed this action and decided unanimously to remove this person from our private Facebook page until such time as the individual engages in conversation with any member of the Executive Committee. Following said conversation, the decision may be revisited or additional action may be taken.

2024 Budget Presentation: Grace Bruen, Finance Chair

Recap of 2023:

Continued Changes in 2024: 1) Search for a new pastor; 2) Retirement of Office Administrator; 3) New Communications Coordinator; 4) New worship and gathering opportunities (WNL); 5) Restoration of building exterior.

Income: Giving to current expenses is not meeting 2023 goals. Current income is \$11,289 behind projections. Projected to be –\$5,543 at end of the year.

Electronic Giving: Total electronic donors in 2023 was 49, with 12 recurring donors. Total amount given electronically YTD 2023 \$26,595. Average transaction \$60.86. Fees YTD \$853 with \$427 covered by donations (50%).

Membership: Three new members, four confirmands, 6 transfer out of membership, 13 deaths.

Capital Spending: Repointing of exterior building, roof repair over organ pipe chamber, hatch and winch repair for AC.

Attendance: Attendance has not returned to pre-

Attendance: Attendance has not returned to pre-Covid levels.

Themes for 2024:

Heavy draw from investments needed to increase active membership and visibility in community. Search for Communications Coordinator. Evaluate programming and activities to increase attendance and participation. Encourage lay participation. Current trend moving toward reliance on income other than congregational giving.

Encourage giving to support staff and services. Increase active membership.

Income Accounts:

Tithes and Offerings: Forecast for 2023 tithes/offerings expected to be \$398,404 (–1.6%). Increase budget amount by \$5,000 to \$410,000. Events and Fund Raisers: Increase budget amount by \$6,700.

Flowers: Decrease budget amount by \$500. Investments and Transfers: The proposed budget amount to be withdrawn from investments to meet planned expenses in 2024 is \$139,195 (6.66% over 2023 budget). Investments are held by Vanguard and Janney and controlled by St. John's.

Special Funds and Investments to fund new position: Planned \$51,600 to fund new position. Rental: Montessori School has long-term lease with rent increases built in. Increase budget amount by \$1,000.

Immediate Needs: Transfer \$2,000 for Trustees use.

Use of Building: Increase budgeted amount by \$1,000.

Income Summary: The 2024 budget total income increases by \$24,489 (4.1%) from 2023. Forecast budget 2024 is \$35,734 (6.1%) higher than 2023 forecasted end of the year actual. [continued on next page]

Expense Accounts:

Staff Salary/Benefits: For additional detail and breakout, see page 11 of this *Enlightener*.

Building: No change in budget amount of \$60,000 for snow removal, pest control, grounds maintenance and utilities.

Communication Coordinator Position: Contract salary of \$41,600 and \$10,000 operational budget. Expense Summary: The 2024 budgeted expenses increase by \$24,490 (4.10%) from 2023 budgeted amount. Adding \$51,600 expenses to support Communications Coordinator role results in a net increase of \$76,090 (12.75%).

Benevolences:

Benevolence funds are donated as designated and never used for current expenses.

OCWM:

St. John's 2023 actual as of October is \$33,244 which is \$11,756 below target of \$45,000.

Special Funds:

GEM Fund (Going the Extra Mile): To help people or organizations when it is not possible to request donations from the congregation. Council votes on distributions. Bequest giving rules require 10% of undesignated bequests be directed to GEM. A \$500 donation each for Lansdale Police and Fairmount Fire Department have been previously approved per Council vote.

Emergency Fund: Funds used to help the local community with immediate needs given to St. Vincent de Paul quarterly. Distributions are determined by St. Vincent de Paul. Church members in need are able to contact the church office directly.

Questions/Comments on Budget Presentation: Communications Coordinator:

Liz Vanderburg stated the overall intent of this position is to have someone with a unified message for internal and external church communications.

Internal: relative to Staff, Committees, Boards, and Artist Series. External: relative to events, new worshippers, new ideas.

Grace Bruen explained in the budget presentation the job is part-time contract for 20 hrs/wk with no benefits or Social Security expenses. The plan is to use Memorial Funds and Investments to fund the position and associated operating budget.

Motion to adopt 2024 Budget:

Motion to adopt 2024 budget was approved unanimously. Contact Grace Bruen or Matt Carson with questions.

Visioning/Search and Call

Mark Bruen gave an overview of findings of the Visioning process. The Visioning phase is complete, and findings will be passed to the Profile Team. MissionInsite, a UCC Conference tool, is being used to determine demographic trends in our area. It is anticipated the church profile will be completed in January 2024 with a formal search to begin January/February 2024.

Communications Role

Liz Vanderburg discussed highlights of the proposed Communications Role. The new role would coordinate communications, both internal and external, for all groups, events, council, and staff. Numerous churches in our area have this position. The job description is being written by the Personnel Committee, with anticipated posting of the job in early 2024. There will be two votes on hiring of the Communications Coordinator: one for the budget and the other for the role itself. Liz stated this role is vital to the future of St. John's

Financial Update

Grace Bruen presented a recap of the 2023 financial year.

Capital funds and Immediate Needs include repointing of the church building. All funds donated to the Exterior Restoration Capital Fund are used only for that project. The next phase will not begin until funds are collected. Projects in 2024 are a continuation of the repointing of the building and will address water penetration in the Assembly Hall. The current balance of all capital funds is \$60,064.

Communications Role funding would come from a combination of special funds and investments.
