

Christmas Eve Late Service God Incarnate Taking Place

Said in a slightly different way, *The Divine Word Became Jesus*. This is no minor thing. It was an earth-shattering revelation because Love, in its fullest expression and intensity, was coming to live with us forever. That love lives today, despite attempts to dismiss or undermine it.

It was considered common knowledge that God chose or "adopted" particular individuals, such as kings, to convey the essence of the divine kingdom. But with the birth of Jesus, something radical and unprecedented was revealed. The entirety of God's message, the Word became Flesh, came to live among us. Tonight, we celebrate the birth of our Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. Good news of great joy for all the people.



This fruit doth make my soul to thrive, it keeps my dying faith alive: Which makes my soul in haste to be with Jesus Christ the apple tree.


Worship the Lord in holy splendor; tremble before him, all the earth.


