*CALL TO WORSHIP

*CONFESSION

God of healing and wholeness, sometimes people share their pain, struggles, and suffering with us, and we quickly sympathize. Beyond that, we struggle with how best to be present to them. We think in terms of a "cure" or "fixing" or "advice giving" without understanding what might be needed is "healing." God, help guide us to become channels of healing so that those with whom we surround ourselves come to experience something more of both your and our presence. We confess that we can keep a certain kind of distance from others in pain. Maybe we want to protect ourselves from bearing the heartache. Maybe we're weary and tired ourselves, and don't have the energy or patience to be present to others in a way that soothes and comforts. Healing God, help us trust that what matters most is that we show up, and that we take the time to understand the depth of pain of those who are hurting. It's then your presence and power can be felt, and healing can happen. Amen.

For all the heavy burdens we carry, and for all the ways we drift away from our sacred center, God, you are there. When we are brave enough to be honest with ourselves, you hear us, and forgive us, and release us from our sins. **Praise be to God!**






Saturday, February 10, 9:30am - Church Library
