As St. John's continues on this journey of change, we are working hard to achieve our vision of a loving and sharing community that strives to reach out to others and find more opportunities to connect with our local community in Lansdale and surrounding communities.

We have accomplished a lot in the first 3 months of this 2024 Church Council session, but still have more to do as we complete some of our critical staffing related tasks and begin to focus more on our longer term initiatives and outreach to the community.

Transition Period - While Searching for Our New Senior Pastor

Dale, our Interim Senior Pastor, is retiring end of May. We will celebrate his time with us after church with a luncheon on May 19th.

We have completed a call agreement for a **Bridge Support Pastor** to help us through the time after Dale retires until we have a Settled Senior Pastor onboard. Our Bridge Pastor, Reverend Thomas Adil, is starting May 16th and will be working to support Reverend Addie (who will be Acting Lead Pastor) during our search. Thank you to the Bridge Pastor search team and team lead Bill Leslie for their diligence in completing this important task.

CELEBRATING OUR 20TH ANNIVERSARY




The Praying Hands Stitchers will be celebrating our 20th anniversary with a Prayer Shawl Sunday on May 5th during the 10:15 worship service.

First Quarter Finance Report



Our Current Outlook:

To properly track the financial picture for St. John's, it is important to understand that while St. John's monthly expenses are fairly constant throughout the year, giving to St. John's is more seasonal. We see higher giving to St. John's at the beginning of the year, as several people give on an annual basis, and at the end of the year during Advent and Christmas. In addition, in the summer we do not receive rent from the Montessori school. To be able to cover our expenses during these summer months, it is important to have a buffer of additional income now.

After the first quarter, we are \$4,167 behind where we need to be to cover our expenses in future months. If you are able, adding \$5 to your donation to current expenses would go a long way in lowering this deficit. Giving to OCWM for the first quarter is right where we need to be, and we are on track to be able to give the full pledged amount of \$41,500.

Are you drawing your RMD?

If you are currently drawing from your retirement accounts, there is a tax advantage to directing funds directly to St. John's. Drawing from retirement accounts becomes taxable income, but if it is sent directly to a charity from a retirement account, it is not considered taxable income. This is especially helpful for those who must draw a required minimum distribution (RMD). [continued on next page]

Funds sent directly to St. John's are counted as part of your RMD but are not taxed.

Please consider using this method for donating to current expenses on a monthly, quarterly, or annual basis. If you find you have additional funds you can give, please also consider directing these funds to our Exterior Restoration Fund. Giving to this fund will allow St. John's to continue restoring sections of the exterior walls to stop the water infiltration that is causing interior deterioration. Financial Report, Matt Carson, Treasurer:

In March St. John's exceeded our goal for tithes and offerings, receiving \$47,165.46 against a budgeted amount of \$30,382.00 a nice recovery compared to the first two months of the year. We had total income of \$63,850.33 (including the budget transfer of \$11,599.58), against a budgeted amount of \$35,498.67, meaning we exceeded our income projections by \$28,351.66.

Current Business/Priority Initiatives Priority #1: Hire Bridge Pastor/Other Staff Changes

Bridge Pastor: (Bill Leslie)

The Search Team completed the in-person interviews and unanimously voted to offer the position to Pastor Thomas Adil.

He verbally accepted our offer on Friday, March 22. The Call Agreement was drafted, reviewed, and approved by the team and the Conference. Pastor Tom suggested revisions, which were then reviewed by the team. A final Call Agreement was approved and accepted by Pastor Tom on April 10.

Pastor Tom will be joining St. John's officially on May 16. He has a good understanding of the role he will be playing here at St. John's in supporting Addie.

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He has recently retired from a position as Director of Spiritual Care at Reading Hospital. He has extensive experience as a Bridge and Interim pastor at numerous churches including Heidelberg UCC in Hatfield. He and his wife live in Birdsboro.

Many thanks to Sally Atkiss, Kelly Bresadola, and Tom Allebach for their assistance on the Search Team. Thanks also to Mark Bruen, Deb Dayton, Grace Bruen, and Margie Jewell for their support and participation. It was a true team effort.

We are all very excited to have Pastor Tom join us and we are very confident he will be a great asset to Addie and St. John's.

<u>Formation of St. John's Communications Task</u> <u>Force: (Mark Bruen)</u>

Per the bylaws, Church Council has the power to establish a task force for a special purpose. Mark Bruen presented to Council a proposal to start a Communications Task Force to help guide St. John's through the process to expand and improve the internal and external communications, in conjunction with the addition of the new Communications Coordinator, Grace Marchione. Task Force Mission:

- Improve our Internal communications to current members so all know of the opportunities for religious events, fellowship, group activities, and other happenings at St. John's.
- Expand and improve our external communications to those in our surrounding communities to make them aware of St. John's and to reach out and broaden our community outreach activities.
- Become the primary interface with the Communications Coordinator to review proposed plans, branding proposals, major communications media upgrades, signage, etc.
- Establish a consistent and positive branding vision for St. John's use in our communications efforts.
- Update our social media: website, Facebook, and other forms.
- Update and improve our printed communications, in line with our newly formed branding vision.
- Define the processes for St. Johns council and groups to more effectively communicate using the resources of the Communications Coordinator.

Proposal:

Establish a task force to work hand in hand with Grace M:

- Mark Hogan to chair the task force.
- A representative from each board to provide input and guidance.
- Two at-large representatives, to be determined by Mark Hogan in consultation with Mark Bruen.
- President and Vice President as members.

 Earth Day (April 22). Creation Stewards bags and Garden of Health Day in Hatfield on April 27. The Creation Stewards will be distributing reusable grocery bags with the St. John's logo on Sunday, April 28. All that we ask is that you "Take the Pledge," to stop using plastic bags, and use reusable bags whenever you shop. If you forget your reusable bags, go back to your car and get them. Plastic bags are terrible for the environment and for our health. Here are a few facts:

10 Facts About Single-Use Plastic Bags

The world uses 5 trillion plastic bags a year.³
Americans use an average of 365 plastic bags per person per year. People in Denmark use an average of four plastic bags per year.⁴

It only takes about 14 plastic bags for the equivalent of the gas required to drive one mile.⁵

In 2015 about 730,000 tons of plastic bags, sacks, and wraps were generated (including PS, PP, HDPE, PVC & LDPE) in the United States, but more than 87% of those items are never recycled, winding up in landfills and the ocean.⁶

About 34% of dead leatherback sea turtles_have ingested plastics.²

The plastic typically used in bottles, bags, and food containers contains chemical additives such as endocrine disruptors, which are associated with negative health effects including cancers, birth defects, and immune system suppression in humans and wildlife.⁸

It takes 1,000 years for a plastic bag to degrade in a landfill. Unfortunately, the bags don't break down completely but instead photodegrade, becoming microplastics that absorb toxins and continue to pollute the environment.⁹

Chemical leachates from plastic bags impair the growth of the world's most important microorganisms, Prochlorococcus, a marine bacterium that provides one tenth of the world's oxygen.¹⁰

There were 1.9 million grocery bags and other plastic bags collected in the 2018 International Coastal Cleanup. 11

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In 2014 California became the first state to ban plastic bags. As of March 2018, 311 local bag ordinances have been adopted in 24 states, including Hawaii. As of July 2018, 127 countries have adopted some form of legislation to regulate plastic bags. 13
