

In December, I recently ended an almost 30-year career at Reading Hospital where I held various jobs, including the Director of Adolescent Services in the Department of Psychiatry (I'm a trained Art Therapist and Licensed Professional Counselor) and the Director of the Department of Spiritual Care. All the while I have served part time as an Interim Pastor in around 20 UCC churches in the area. As a Christian and as a Pastor, I have learned how increasingly important it has become to be more comfortable with managing the demands of change. Seeing how Jesus favored the underprivileged, for us in the UCC this often means (as a predominantly white denomination) being more comfortable with being uncomfortable. It also means being more in tune with and dependent on the Spirit, which is alternatingly (as Pastor Dale said this week in his sermon) amazing, exciting, and terrifying! I look forward to meeting and interacting more with you all -- the wonderful people of St. John's in Lansdale as we work together to serve others in the community in the name of our Lord!



WHAT'S UP IN COUNCIL?



Financial Report: Grace Bruen, Financial Chair

In April St. John's exceeded our goal for tithes & offerings, receiving \$34,696.25 against a budgeted amount of \$30,720, exceeding our projections by \$3,976.25. We had total income of \$51,401.89 (including the budgeted transfer of \$11,599.58), against a budgeted amount of \$47,782.26, meaning we exceeded our expectations by \$3,619.63. Expenses were \$58,791.21 against a budgeted amount of \$51,006.53. St. John's came out short of our expenses by -\$7,784.68. We are entering the spring and summer months, and a budget shortfall is expected.

We continue to budget by month, expecting to accumulate a buffer of income early in the year to last us through the predicted slump of summer months. We have received income year to date of \$223,199.13 against expenses of 220,257.32, giving us a net income YTD of \$2,942. We have projected a buffer of \$11,273, meaning we are behind our projection by -\$8,331, compared to our shortfall at the end of March of -\$4,166. We have just about doubled the shortfall as compared to last month. *[continued on next page]*

We can expect income to continue to be below expenses through the summer months.

Donations to our Church's Wider Mission (OCWM) were \$2,516.00 for April and \$26,557 for the year against a projection of \$15,895, meaning we are \$662 ahead of our projection.



Mainstreet Brass


Sunday, November 10, 2024, 4pm


