
**Hymnals** are on the back of the pew in front of you. **Bibles** are on a shelf beneath the pew in front of you.




Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Lenten season and the journey to the cross.

## Wednesday Night Live! Adult Education Class

With Pastor Tom Adil 6:15 pm

Adult Education Class will discuss "A Hole in the World" by Amanda Held Opelt. When Amanda Held Opelt suffered a season of loss – including three miscarriages and the unexpected death of her sister, *New York Times* bestselling writer Rachel Held Evans – she was confronted with sorrow she didn't know how to face.

Her search for answers led her to discover that generations past embraced a robust array of rituals that served as vessels for pain and aided in the process of grieving and healing. Today, many of these traditions have been lost as religious practice declines, cultures amalgamate, death is sanitized, and pain is averted.

During discussion we work on drawing mandalas! If you have missed the reading, you can listen along to the discussion and share your own stories while we draw.
