
**Hymnals** are on the back of the pew in front of you. **Bibles** are on a shelf beneath the pew in front of you.

During this season of Lent, the Adult Education Class will be following the curriculum of **The Hardest Part**, a podcast series by Kate Bowler. From her website:

Lent is here—the season we stop pretending we're fine and admit that life is...a lot. It's forty days of naming what's fragile, walking toward the hard truths, and resisting the urge to skip straight to the happy ending.

The Hardest Part explores the complexities of life, faith, and the challenges we face. In this series, she addresses difficult questions about how to remain compassionate in a harsh world and how to navigate faith during tough times. The series includes reflections, response prompts, and blessings to help listeners process life's fragilities and uncertainties.

While we talk about the lessons and listen to snippets, we will continue drawing our mandalas. Handouts for further home study will be provided.


